The total anticipated costs for the project are \$7,485.25 for Phase 1 and \$5,014.75 for Phase 2. After working with Mr. Lewis and his staff, and compiling a lot of the safety information necessary for the data analysis in the plan, Phase 1 of the project was completed in September with the total expenses for this reporting period coming out to \$7,485.25, well below our budget of \$12,500.00. The remaining funds of \$5,014.75 left in the budget will be carried forward and used to fund Phase 2 of the Safety Plan Project set to begin during the first half of the upcoming Fiscal Year.

This work this period involved learning reporting requirements and studying CFRs, expanding the inventory, defining our inventory, planning to expand our inventory more in the future, planning and applying for funding involving safety planning, planning for an LRTP overhaul, calling the BIA transportation specialist with multiple multilayered questions, meeting with other Tribal officials to discuss and plan for this grant, contracting for materials for our projects, planning for the instillation of those materials, organizing the team that's going to execute this project. This is all while learning about my Tribe's current position in the program and planning for direction we need to go. Our maintenance crew cleans the pot holes with push brooms and an air compressor to blow out dirt and debris, and then they fill the holes with asphalt millings and then fill them with asphalt. Over 50 streets have been repaired. Winter is hard in Montana and specifically on the Blackfeet Indian Reservation. Strong winds cause high snow drifts that completely block many residential roadways. These drastic seasonal changes have shifted our maintenance crew priorities to snow removal. Our crew is on call as needed and will continue to plow and clear the streets of Browning and all other areas of the reservation.

The Roads Maintenance Activities accomplished in 2020 include the hiring of three (3) personnel to serve as laborers and equipment operators necessary to complete tasks, duties, and responsibilities necessary to maintain routes within the Tribes' Service area. Additional activities included the acquisition of equipment including mowers, weed eaters, reflectometer, equipment trailer, and a skid steer with various attachments. The personnel did use the equipment acquired to focus on maintaining routes on the Concho, Clinton, and Canton reserve with a schedule to include Colony and Redmoon reserves.
