


MAKING SAFETY EVERYONE'S BUSINESS: **INTEGRATE SAFETY INTO ALL PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS** Phil Bobitz, FHWA Office of Safety Jerry Roche, FHWA Office of Safety

How can transportation agencies, stakeholders, and advocates better work together to improve road safety for all users and achieve the goal of zero fatalities?

The Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), core Federal-aid funding program for safety, represents only 6 percent of the available funds from the Federal-aid Highway Program. HSIP funds alone cannot eliminate fatalities on roadways. Agencies should integrate safety into other transportation projects, as every transportation project is a chance to **improve safety**. Transportation agencies, practitioners, stakeholders, and advocates can work together to identify opportunities and incorporate changes to improve safety in transportation projects throughout the project development process.

How States are integrating safety into all programs & projects:



Establish policies and processes that prioritize accommodations of all users from project initiation.

Adopt policies and procedures to conduct safety performance assessments on each project, regardless of funding source. Safety performance assessments quantify the potential effects of transportation investment decisions in terms of crash frequency and severity.


Develop design manuals that support improving safety for all road users, practices for assessing and evaluating safety performance, and guidance on when and how to use safety countermeasures.

Provide training on the Safe System Approach to broaden staff awareness and build a culture of safety.
