



Need for the Plan


- Significant regional population and employment growth
- Increasing demand for yearround recreational opportunities
- Impact of growth on WYDOT's mission in providing safe and effective transportation
- Potential for conflicts (vehicular, user, wildlife, etc.)

Teton County, WY and Teton County, ID Population and Employment Growth 1970-2020



High Traffic Volumes & Congestion on WY 22 / ID 33

- Contributing factors:
 - Large commuting population located in the Teton Valley
 - Job growth in Teton County, WY
 - Increased tourist visitation
 - Freight & goods movement





Facility Overuse & Parking Congestion

- High-use trail access sites along the Teton Pass corridor
- Significant growth in recreation use
- Limited parking and pullout capacity
- Lack of alternative transportation options



Extreme Winter Weather & Challenging Topography

- Avalanche risk and mitigation
- Dozens of slide paths traverse the roadway
- Maximum grade of 10% and sharp curves




Resource Impacts

- Vehicle wildlife collisions
- Biological conservation and habitat connectivity

Identify a range of feasible transportation options that can be advanced by partners

Scope of Work Task: Stakeholder Engagement & Public Involvement

- On-site corridor tour with PMT
- In person Stakeholder interviews (Fall 2021)
- Virtual stakeholder interviews from Idaho
- Project website and feedback form
- Public review and comment of draft report



Existing Conditions Baseline

- Multimodal existing conditions and future trends profile
 - Traffic data
 - Parking capacities, dimensions
 - Roadway dimensions
 - Alternative transportation
 - Signage inventory
- Corridor safety assessment
- Review of existing plans and studies



<u>Development of Corridor Management Strategy –</u> <u>Needs Identification</u>

- Define limits of corridor capacity
 - Parking availability
 - Vehicle occupancy rate
 - Estimate level of daily visitation

<u>Development of Corridor Management Strategy –</u> <u>Scenario Analysis</u>

- Transportation and access scenario development and analysis
 - 1. Parking permitting option
 - 2. Transit only option
 - 3. Hybrid parking & transit



Development of Transportation Improvement Options

Review and consideration of:

- Formalized parking configurations
- Transit service feasibility
- Wayfinding signage upgrades
- Pedestrian and wildlife crossing improvements
- Highway to trailhead entry/exit improvements
- Safety & operational improvements



Scope of Work Task: Draft and Final Report

- Summarize planning process, including public outreach, data collection, needs identification, and scenario development
- Preliminary cost estimation for specific solutions
- Phasing of improvements
- Partnering opportunities and innovative finance
- Narrative of how to advance solutions


